### Science Community Center!

To be lost among the waves of people, fighting through the intense crowds of East Campus on the first day of Spring or Fall semester classes is not only typical, its practically custom. However, the butts-to-guts lines and the shoulder-to-shoulder classes has some slight alleviation this Fall, leaving us to ponder whether or not we can and should get used to this bit of extra breathing room. The fact that one nearly had enough space to do a jumping jack in the East Campus Student Center may largely be thanks to the new West Campus addition, the Community Science Center—which drew new, unprecedented numbers to the West Campus for the first week of classes. The new Science Center had been under construction for more than a year and in the planning phases for much longer; but since the Measure E Bond had supplied the funding to build and complete, the Center has absorbed most, if not all, of MJC's science courses.

The exterior of the edifice is quite eye-catching with the small jumping fountains, the names of historical scientists brandished on the seating, and of course the giant operational telescope. In the main stairwell at the front of the building there is a model of a double-helix—a strand of DNA with the genetic sequence visible on each step of the stairs. On the first floor of the Science Center there are models of the planets of our solar system embedded in the ceiling—this display not to be confused with the planetarium in the building which should be having star-shows in the near future; for now, the room is being used for classes. However, you can have a sneak preview from the outside of the building since it's tastefully decorated with constellations which light up at night. With all of these attractions in one building, it's no wonder The Great Valley Museum is expected to pack up and move from across the street from East Campus on Stoddard, to West Campus soon. Should students be interested in the solar system display, or just checking out the building, be sure to walk all the way through the first floor to find the addition suggested and paid for by ASMJC: the Foucault Pendulum. Every hour, a small metal cylinder is knocked over by a large weighty pendulum in demonstration of the Earth's rotation. Go check out the new Community Science Center on West Campus, there is lots to see, and keep your ears open to hear about events coming soon to be hosted in our new campus addition
